

## RACHMANINOFF CHEERED.

**He Plays His New Piano Concerto  
as Russian Symphony's Guest.**

The Russian Symphony Orchestra, with Sergei Rachmaninoff as guest, gave its third subscription concert in Carnegie Hall last evening before an audience of compatriots that stood and cheered the composer-pianist for several minutes after his Concerto Op. 1, No. 1, which he performed in revised version for the first time, practically a new work.

Conductor Altschuler opened with Stravinsky's Symphony No. 1, which had had its first American hearing by the Russians in a former season, and was of interest in view of next week's revival of his "Petruška." There were also an "Idyl" from Scriabine's Symphony No. 2, and Rimsky-Korsakoff's "Tsar Saltan," a bit of folklore that in its music blends oddly with "Coq d'Or." The program will be further reviewed in THE TIMES after its repetition in the same hall this afternoon.
