Although the commission may desire more bids which to consider the bids submitted, it is possible that the contract will be awarded tomorrow evening. After the contract is awarded plans will be made immediately for contracts for the building which, it is now believed, will be located on the easterly side of Mendon road at the junction of Broad street, Lonsdale avenue and Mendon road. The land in question belongs to the Lonsdale Company. Within a few days the commission will ask the company to donate a property, and it is thought that the request will be granted. Several weeks ago Joseph V. Broderick, chairman of the commission, and J. A. Mitchell, superintendent of schools and clerk of the commission, and Charles A. Dexter, former chairman of the School Committee and a member of the commission, visited the several sites proposed with Robert Taylor, superintendent of the Lonsdale Company.
